ENGLISH

9th Grade English

Full Year	Class Code: EN091
Grades: 9th	Class Fees: None

Prerequisites: None

This course continues to build language skills, specifically in the areas of reading, writing, and critical thinking. You will read both fiction and nonfiction and will write in a variety of genres.

9th Grade Honors English

Full Year	Class Code: EN09H1
Grades: 9th	Class Fees: None

Prerequisites: None

This is an accelerated class for students who excel in English. The pace is fast and the depth in some areas is extensive. Out of class reading requirements and extension activities are part of the curriculum. Projects will be a part of each unit of study. This class also focuses on higher level writing skills.

Business Office Specialist

Semester	Class Code: CS100
Grades: 9th	Class Fees:

Prerequisites: None

This course applies advanced concepts and principles using word processing, spreadsheets, databases, and electronic presentation software. You will integrate applications learned from past business classes. <u>This is an</u> <u>accelerated course</u>, and is not intended for the basic or introductory Microsoft Office user. The focus of this class will be getting students certified in Microsoft Office Programs.

Digital Business Applications

Semester	Class Code: C26010
Grades: 9th	Class Fees:

Prerequisites: None

This is not an App making class. This course is designed to prepare you with the knowledge and skills to be an asset to the collaborative, global, and innovative world of today and tomorrow. Concepts include: the overall digital experience, digital communications, digital media, and the exploration of career choices. This course also provides practical experience in professionalism using various forms of presentation skills including: speaking, podcasting, and digital portfolios relating to the globalization of business.

Web Development

Semester

Class Code: C61010

Grades: 9th Class Fees:

Prerequisites: None

This is a course designed to guide you in a project-based environment, in the development of up-to-date concepts and skills that are used in the development of today's websites. You will learn the fundamentals of how the internet works and the basic building blocks of the World Wide Web: HTML5 coding, Cascading Style Sheets (CSS), and JavaScript. You will follow the steps to create a website by planning, designing, developing, deploying, and maintaining website projects. You will also learn and use different scripting technologies to create dynamic and interactive websites and what it takes for a career in web development as you complete projects and create your own website(s).

MATH

Secondary Math 1

Full Year

Grades: 9th

Class Fees: None

Class Code: M0901

Prerequisites: None

This course includes the study of solving systems of equations and inequalities, sequences, exponential functions, a comparison between functions, geometry, data and statistics.

Secondary Math 1 Honors

Full Year	Class Code: M090H1
Grades: 9th	Class Fees: None
Prerequisites: None	

Secondary 1 Honors is the first course in the honors path. Most students in the honors path calculus as a senior. This course includes all of the topics from regular Secondary I plus the study of vectors and matrices.

Secondary Math 2 HonorsFull YearClass Code: M100H1

Prerequisites: Intermediate Math 2 GT

Secondary 2 Honors is the second course in the honors path. A student in the honors path may take AP Calculus their Junior year. Students will study quadratic expressions, equations, and functions, extend the set of rational numbers to the set of complex numbers, link probability and data through conditional probability and counting methods, study similarity and right triangle trigonometry, and study circles with their quadratic algebraic representations.

SCIENCE

Earth Science

Full YearClass Code: S2001

Class Fees:

Grades: 9th

Prerequisites: None

The Earth Science Standards emphasize "systems" as an organizing concept to understand life on Earth, geological change, and the interaction of atmosphere, hydrosphere, and biosphere. You will use science and engineering practices to develop conceptual understanding of the organization of matter and energy in space, patterns in the history and processes of the earth, system interactions of the atmosphere, hydrosphere, and geosphere, and stability and change in natural resources.

Honors Biology

Full Year

Grades: 9th	Class Fees: None

Class Code: S300H1

Prerequisites: None

This is an introductory course where you will engage in the science and engineering practices to develop conceptual understanding of interactions between organisms and the environment, the structure and function of living systems and their components, genetic patterns, and evolutionary change. Remember, if you take biology this year, you will have to take chemistry or physics next year. The chemistry and physics courses typically require challenging math.

SOCIAL STUDIES

AP Human Geography

Full Year	Class Code: HWGA1
Grades: 9th	Class Fees: None

Prerequisites: None

AP Human Geography is an introductory college-level human geography course. You will cultivate your understanding of human geography through data and geographic analyses as we explore topics like: patterns and spatial organization, human impacts and interactions with their environment, and spatial processes and societal changes.

World Geography & Civilizations

Prerequisites None

In this class you will study the various cultures of the world, including lifestyle, political and social trends, and advancing technology. It will utilize skills to understand the practical application of geography to everyday life throughout the use and study of maps. This class combines geographic study with world civilizations. You will study people, places, significant events, cultures, and environments. You will also examine human experience in at least six spheres of human activity as well as understand how geography relates to life.

Art Foundations

Art Foundations is a prerequisite for all other art classes. You will learn foundational skills such as line, shape, value, color, composition, and how they are used in art. You will create a variation of projects with a variety of mediums such as pencil, colored pencils, wire, and watercolor. You will gain insights on exploring diverse mediums and artists that will inspire your work.

2D Art

Prerequisite: Art Foundations

In this Learner-Centered art class, you will create drawings and paintings using a variety of 2-D mediums like ink, pastel, acrylic paint, and watercolor paint. You'll apply insights to your work that you gain from art history, perspective and contemporary art practices. You will build your artistic skills and make excellent art in this hands-on course.

3D Art & Crafts

Semester

Grades: 8th & 9th

Class Code: A2110

Class Fees: \$20

Prerequisite: Art Foundations

In this Learner-Centered art class you will create a variety of sculpture projects using a wide array of mediums including paper, cardboard, tape, sculpey polymer clays, paper mâché, and wire. You'll apply insights to your work that you gain from art history, perspective and contemporary art practices. You will build artistic skills and make excellent art in this hands-on course.

Honors Art

Grades: 9th	Class Fees: \$20

Prerequisites: Art Foundations

You will study a variety of mediums such as alcohol-based markers, printmaking, bookmaking, and creating digital portfolios. This class will be a project-based class allowing you to decide to focus on either 2D or 3D art. Honors Art is the most advanced studio art class taught in school. Some outside work and preparation for projects will be expected.

BAND

Jazz Band	
Full Year	Class Code: A3111
Grades: 8th & 9th	Class Fees: \$3

Prerequisites: Previous Band experience & Teacher approval

In this class you will develop fundamental skills of Jazz style, improvisation, and jazz literature. Jazz Band Instruments include: Percussion, Piano, Guitar, Bass, Trumpet, Trombone, and Saxophone. Curriculum includes 6-8 performances per year as well as possible regional and state level festivals. You are required to have a working instrument and a metronome/tuner.

Symphonic Band

Grades: 8-9	Class Fees: \$3

Audition Required: Audition information and dates will be announced soon.

This band further develops and refines the performance skills and abilities developed in previous band classes. We will also participate in regional and state level festivals. Some of the instruments may be available to rent from the school. You will be required to have a working instrument and a metronome/tuner.

Wind Symphony

This advanced band further develops and refines the performance skills and abilities

developed in previous Band clases. Curriculum includes 4-8 performances per year. Students will also participate in regional and state level festivals. Some of the more expensive instruments (Tuba, Euphonium, Bassoon, French Horn, Oboe, etc.) may be available to rent from the school. Students are required to have a working instrument and a metronome/tuner.

CTE

Animal Science	
Semester	Class Code: C16010
Grades: 9th	Class Fees: None

Prerequisites: None

In this course you will walk away with the beginning knowledge of animal principles, such as genetics, anatomy, physiology/nutrition, disease, pests, and management practices. You will get to have many hands-on experiences that expose you to different agricultural animal related careers. Students who are enrolled in this course have the opportunity to sign up and participate in the FFA Organization.

Apparel Design & Production 1

Semester	Class Code: C33040
Grades: 9th	Class Fees: None

Prerequisites: None

This course is designed to explore the textile world. You will learn fiber through fabric construction to clothing care. You will create projects to demonstrate the required sewing techniques. You will need to purchase your own fabric for each of the class projects.

Construction Technology

Prerequisites: None

Do you want to learn how to build a building? Through hands-on shop activities, you will be introduced to basic skills, applications, and impacts related to Construction Technology. You will learn the basic concepts of blueprint reading, foundations, floor and wall construction, roof trusses, shingles, electrical work, and exteriors as they design then construct full-size playhouses for storage sheds! You can continue in high school where they have the opportunity to build a real home during the school year.

Engineering Technology

Semester	Class Code: C81020
Grades: 9th	Class Fees: None

Prerequisites: None

Do you know how things work? Have you ever wondered why they are built that way? This engaging and challenging hands-on class introduces you to the engineering design process and basic concepts of Mechanical, Structural, Electrical, and Manufacturing Engineering. You will identify problems, then design and create their own prototype solutions using a wide variety of technologies, tools, and machines. Much of the class time will be spent in the lab/shop setting as students develop abilities, attitudes, and knowledge that will in turn expand your occupational opportunities in the world of engineering. This class fulfills the explorer course requirement for the Engineering Career Pathway you can continue in high school.

Floral Design

Semester

Grades: 9th

Class Fees: \$15

Class Code: C15120

Prerequisites: Nones

In this course you will learn everything you need to know about Floral Design. You will use the principals and elements of design to create a variety of different floral arrangements including holiday arrangements, corsages, boutonnieres and centerpieces. You will also learn the business and marketing side of floral design as they learn how to calculate the price of their own arrangements. Students who are enrolled in this course have the opportunity to sign up and participate in the FFA Organization.

Food & Nutrition 1

This course will introduce you to the science of food and nutrition. You will have the opportunity to develop skills in kitchen safety, food preparation, and the fundamentals of human nutrition. You will participate in hands-on cooking labs and food experiments designed to help you follow a recipe and apply course content into your daily life.

Intro to Behavioral Health

Prerequisites: None

This class is designed to help you understand more about behavioral healthcare and how to increase your own mental health awareness. We will discuss career pathways in therapy, rehabilitation and behavioral health. You will also learn and explore concepts related to self-concept, goals, stress, coping skills, communication, relationships, addiction, codependency, mental health disorders and suicide prevention. This class is the Explorer Course for the Behavioral Health Pathway.

Robotic Technology

DANCE

Dance Fundamentals

Semester

Class Code: A5000 Class Fees: \$3

Grades: 7th - 9th

Prerequisites: None

NO EXPERIENCE REQUIRED for this beginning course. It is the foundation for all other dance classes at Viewpoint Middle School. This beginning level course builds dance knowledge and skills in technique, improvisation, choreography, artistic expression, performance, history, culture, healthy life skills, and connections to other curricular areas. The class content will refer to many styles of dance; however, modern/creative dance will be given primary emphasis.

Men's Dance

Semester	Class Code: A5010
Grades: 7th - 9th	Class Fees: \$3

Prerequisites: None

NO EXPERIENCE REQUIRED for this introduction to dance. Many different dance styles will be explored with an emphasis on the fundamental elements involved in all types of dance- Body, Energy, Space, Time. Emphasis will be placed on the attainment of agility, balance, coordination and increased flexibility. During the semester we will emphasize the use of creativity, self expression, performance, confidence, and teamwork.

Dance 1	
Semester	Class Code: A5010
Grades: 7th - 9th	Class Fees: \$3

Prerequisites: Dance Fundamentals

We will build on the skills dancers learned in Dance Fundamentals as a performer, dance technician, and an artist or creator. Intermediate dance techniques and movements will be taught and different dance styles will be explored. Dancers will perform a dance in the school's dance concert and have the opportunity to choreograph dances in class.

Dance 2

Semester	Class Code: A5020
Grades: 8th & 9th	Class Fees: \$3

Prerequisites: Dance 1

Advanced dance techniques and movements will be taught and different dance styles will be explored. You will also further study aesthetics of dance, learn how dance can be used for communication, as well as expand your personal movement styles and choices. You will also deepen understanding of elements of dance through improvisation, choreography, and performance. Dancers will perform a dance in the school's dance concert and have the opportunity to choreograph dances in class.

Dance Company

Semester	Class Code: A5041
Grades: 8th & 9th	Class Fees: \$3

Previous dance experience required. You will need to audition for this company. Audition dates will be announced soon.

This is Viewpoint's highest performing company for 8th and 9th graders. We perform in various dance concerts throughout the year, as well other performance opportunities that may include performing at school assemblies and competing in Shakespeare Festival. Intermediate/Advanced dance techniques and movements will be taught and different dance styles will be explored. You will deepen your skills as choreographers and will have the opportunity to choreograph at various times. We will focus on teamwork, performance skills, life skills, and artistry.

Social Dance

Prerequisites: None	

Social Dance is a movement expression that emerges from a community. This co-ed partnering dance class is designed to help students learn more about dances that emerge from different cultures and communities. Students will learn the proper techniques, proper etiquette, and styling of different dances which may include the following: cha-cha, waltz, samba, line dances, mixers, and various group dances from different communities. This class must be taken first before you are eligible for the Level 2 class.

Prerequisites: None	

Even if you have never taken a drama class before or even performed on stage, you are the right fit for this class! We will have many hands-on activities that will strengthen our skills in movement, voice, storytelling, improvisation and performing in general. Performing is part of the class and we will focus on building our confidence in performance and communication. You will have many opportunities to be up on your feet and work with other students to explore and create. You will be required to see a play this semester.

Drama 1

Prerequisites: Drama Foundations		

This class builds on Drama Foundations as we continue to practice our performance skills with a focus on creativity and imagination. You will work with other students in developing a number of other skills you can put into your actor's toolkit to help you be successful on the stage. We will explore acting, improv, playwriting, character development, among a variety of other topics. You will be required to see a play per semester.

Drama 2 (Theatre Company)

Grades: 8th & 9th	Class Fees: None

Prerequisites: Drama Foundations

If you are looking for a place to hone in your acting skills, this class will help you build up the tools you need to become a strong and solid performer in straight play-acting. This semester course will include in-class auditions and rehearsals as you participate in our fall play. Although the majority of rehearsals will take place during class, you will be required to attend a number of mandatory after-school rehearsals leading up to the performances as well as the performances themselves.

Musical Theatre

Grades: 7th - 9th	Class Fees: None

There is not an audition for the class, but we will have an audition in class for the roles in the musical.

This class is created to give you the chance to shine on stage as you audition, rehearse, and perform in the school musical while learning the basics of music, singing, choreography, and performing in a musical. Although the majority of rehearsals will take place during class, you will be required to attend a number of mandatory after-school rehearsals leading up to the performances as well as the performances themselves. Singing, dancing, and acting in this class are mandatory. There is not an audition for the class, but we will have an audition in class for the roles in the musical.
